Arrests for Robbery:

Our dedicated Town Centre officers, along with officers from Grange and Town wards arrested four males for a robbery in the Enfield Town Park. The incident occurred in June. The males were identified by CCTV images.

Crimes Recorded in July

BURGLARY

There were 6 recorded burglaries for the month of July across Grange Ward. This is showing a decrease of 7 offences from the previous month.

These consist of 3 residential burglaries, 2 attempted residential burglary (1 was a distraction attempt) and 1 non-residential burglary in the following locations:

RESIDENTIAL (DWELLING)

Raleigh Road EN2 2.30am – 3.49am

The suspect got into the property via a front ground floor window and stole a games console from inside.

Old Park Ridings N21 8.30pm 7.30am

The property is being renovated and the suspect got in via the kitchen window and stole tools and a TV from inside.

Bush Hill N21

The suspects entered the property via the rear French doors whilst the victim was away.

ATTEMPTED RESIDENTIAL (DWELLING)

Amwell Close EN2

The garage door was found damaged but nothing was taken from inside.

The Chine N21 8am

This was a possibly distraction burglary. The victim had a knock at the door by two males who were wearing tops with British Gas logo. They asked to check the meter. The victim refused them entry so they left.

NON RESIDENTIAL (Commercial)

London Road EN2 5.30am – 6.30pm

The suspect entered the building via the back door and ransacked the Box Office.

ROBBERY

The Town EN2 3.45pm – 4pm

The suspect pushed the victim and took the cash from the cash point and ran off.

Genotin Road EN1 10am - 10.05a.m

The victim was approached by three young males who told him to go round the corner with them but he refused and get onto the bus and left the area.







London Road EN2 1.30pm

A female bumped into the victim. The victim did not see her take her purse but she later noticed it missing.

The Town EN2 10.30pm

The victim was threatened with violence to hand over his mobile. The victim punched the suspect and got anyway.

Cheyne Walk Open Space 9.45pm – 10pm

Two male suspects approached the two victims and threatened them for their bicycles so the victims handed them over. The suspects were described as approx. 18 years old. One was tall and thin and the other was short with dark curly hair.

THEFT FROM PERSON

Palace Gardens Shopping Centre 11.30am – 12.00pm

Whilst the victim was shopping in the Centre her purse was stolen from her handbag.

Church Street EN2 11.05am – 11.20am

The victim drew out a large amount of money from the bank. Whilst in the town she was stopped by two Eastern European males who spoke to her. Soon after that she noticed that she no longer had the money in her bag. One of the suspects was described as approx. 45 years old and the other was approx. 25 years old.

The victim's purse was taken out of her backpack whilst in the Centre.

The victim's wallet was in his back pocket. It was missing when he went to pay for goods.

The victim reported that a male took his personal items off of him.

The victim had his mobile phone taken off of him by two male suspects whilst he was waiting for the 191 bus.

The victim reported that her purse had been stolen out of her handbag.

The victim's purse was stolen whilst she was shopping in the Centre.

The victim discovered her bag unzipped and money had been taken from inside.

The Town EN2 1am – 1.05am

Someone barged into the victim and when she checked her bag 10 minutes later, her mobile phone was missing.

Palace Gardens Shopping Centre 11am

The victim reported that someone had taken her purse from her handbag.

Cecil Road 2pm – 2.30pm

Someone had stolen the victim's mobile from her handbag.

Southbury Road EN1 2.25am – 2.30am

Someone unzipped the victim's bag and took her mobile phone.

The Town EN2 2.02pm – 2.24pm

The victim drew out money in the town and put it in her handbag. She noticed the money was missing whilst still in the area.

Palace Exchange Shopping Centre 2.30pm

A female followed the victim into the lift but the female ran out the lift before the door closed. The victim realised soon after that that her phone was not in her bag.

The victim's purse was stolen from her handbag whilst shopping in the Centre.

The victim caught the bus from Ponders End and when he reached Enfield Town he noticed that his money was no longer in his pocket.

MOTOR VEHICLE

There were 19 recorded motor vehicle crimes within the month of July. This is an increase of 5 offences from the previous month.

THEFT FROM MOTOR VEHICLE

The victim's vehicle window was smashed and his dash cam and disable blue badge was stolen.

The victim's vehicle window was smashed and his disable blue badge was stolen from inside.

The victim's number plates were stolen off of his vehicle.

BURGLARY PREVENTION

WHAT TO DO BEFORE YOU LEAVE YOUR HOME

- Close and lock all your doors and windows, even if you are only going out for a few minutes.
- Set your burglar alarm
- Make sure the side and /or back gate is locked.
- Lock your shed or garage.
- Make sure that any valuables are not in sight.
- Put keys out of reach of letterboxes.
- In the evenings, shut curtains and leave some lights on.
- Never leave car documents or ID in obvious places such as kitchens or hallways.

If you are going to be away for days or weeks at a time, you will need to take additional action. Consider asking your neighbours to close curtains, or park on your drive. Use a time device to automatically turn lights and a radio on at night.

ALARMS

Alarms are undoubtedly the most effective deterrent against burglary. To maximize the deterrent, place external active burglar alarm bell boxes (with flashing lights and sounders) at the front and back of the property. Police recommend an installer who is affiliated to an in inspectorate, either the National Security Inspectorate (NSI) or Security System and Alarms Inspection Board (SSAIB). Be aware that DIY alarms will not necessarily receive a police response.

SECURING YOUR BOUNDARIES

Making your home as difficult to get into as possible will help deter criminals, and that starts with your boundaries

- Make sure your front wall is no more than 1 metre high, so a burglar could be seen from the street.
- Make your side and driveway gates are the same height as the boundaries around them.
- Metal side and driveway gates are good because they allow intruders to be seen. Add extra security with an anti-climb top.
- Gravel driveways and paths make a silent approach difficult.
- Store wheelie bins or other potential climbing aids behind locked gates, so burglars can't climb up on them and use them as a ladder.
- Wooden gates can be secured with two hasps and staples and two closed shackle padlocks near the top and the bottom, to prevent leverage.
- Rear and side boundaries should be between 1.8 and 2 metres high. Planting dense or spiky climbing plants acts as an additional deterrent.
- Be aware that using barbed wire, carpet grippers or broken glass on top of walls or fences could cause injury which the occupier could be liable for.









Currently Enfield Metropolitan Police Service are actively trying to encourage more streets to set up their own Neighbourhood Watch Scheme.

A Neighbourhood watch scheme is a way to get to know your neighbours and discuss various issues surrounding the area and how to deal with them.

To set up your own you could ether call your Safer Neighbourhoods team to deliver you a pack or visit the "Our Watch" website which can give you lots of information on what it means to be in a Neighbourhood watch.
